4. Turning aside	<i>"For you were continually straying like sheep, but now you have returned to the Shepherd..."</i>	1 Peter 2:25
5. Being useless	<i>"For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they render you neither useless nor unfruitful..."</i>	2 Peter 1:8
6. Not doing good	<i>"For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works..."</i>	Ephesians 2:10

Acts 2:37


Now when they heard this, they were pierced to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brethren, what shall we do?"
